<u>About the School</u>

SCHOOL RULES

1. REGULAR ATTENDANCE

Students are expected to attend school regularly and to attend all classes.

2. PUNCTUALITY

Students are expected to be on time for school.

3. WORK HABITS

Students are expected to be prepared for and to participate in each class to meet performance standards, to have the necessary class materials, to complete classwork and homework accurately and on time, and to prepare for quizzes, tests and examinations.

4. DRESS AND APPEARANCE

Students must come to school wearing the correct school uniform. Uniform must be neatly cleaned and ironed.
 Personal cleanliness, hygiene and neatness is expected at all times. Hair must be neatly cut/pinned/plaited and combed. Nails must be kept clean and trimmed. Boys must maintain their hair short and neat. Fancy hairstyle is not allowed.

5. SCHOOL PROPERTY

1) Care must be taken to keep the school clean at all times.

2) Students must take care of the school property. No scratches, writings or drawings may be made on the school furniture or walls.

6. BEHAVIOUR

1) Students must respect and obey their teachers and School authorities at all times.

2) Running, playing and shouting in the classrooms and corridors during study hours is forbidden. Students must not indulge in fights and physical and verbal abuse in school. Stringent action will be taken against all students instigating and/or participating in such acts.

3) Students must record and follow the specific instructions given by their teachers.

7A. BASIC CLASSROOM RULES

1)Be in your assigned seat/location, ready to work when the school bell rings.

2)Bring paper, pencils, pens books and all necessary supplies every day.

3)Keep hands, feet, body, objects to yourself (HFBO).

5)Respect others. Swearing, rude gestures, cruel teasing or put-downs are prohibited.

7B. MAINTENANCE OF STUDY MATERIALS

1) All school books must be labelled and neatly maintained throughout the year.

2) Books must be brought according to the day's timetable without fail.

3) Students are not permitted to paste stickers and colour the pages of school notebooks unless specifically instructed by the teachers.

Golden Rules of Good Parenting

1. Kindly check the haircut, uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning.

2. Please see that your ward carries text/ exercise books according to the Time Table for that day. No extra books are allowed.

3. Kindly ensure that he/she is prepared for test and also check regularly his/ her Report Card and teachers' remarks in his/ her class work / homework exercise books and school diary.

4. Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.

5. Parents are requested to follow a formal dress code while visiting the school. <u>Refrain particularly from wearing shorts</u>, <u>bathroom slippers and night suits to school</u>.

6. Parents are requested to take corrective action against the use of abusive language of their child.

7. Encourage your child to eat healthy and nutritive food and a fruit daily, exercise daily, maintain personal hygiene drink sufficient water and avoid intake of junk food.

8. Attend PTMs, workshops, orientations, school functions regularly.

9. Parents are required to inform the school if there is any change in their address and/ or telephone numbers.

10. The school is not responsible for any problem related to transport of students who avail transport other than the school bus.

11.75 % attendance in each term is compulsory for eligibility in the examination. The percentage may be relaxed on genuine medical grounds only.

12. Late comers will not be allowed to enter the class except in special cases as decided by the school authorities. Your ward will not be allowed to leave the school once he/ she has entered it, till dispersal time. No reasons like weddings function, prior appointments with anybody without prior information to school etc., will be accepted. On exam days the child should not be encouraged to go to school for only giving the unit test if he/ she is not feeling well. Habitual late comers may call for disciplinary action including being sent back home. On such occasions, the school shall not be responsible for the safe return of the students.

13. Students who commute in the care of guardians should never leave before the guardians arrive. In case of delay parents should inform the school office.

14. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches, pen drives, pens, i-pads etc) to school.

15. Set limits on the amount of time your child spends watching television, playing with phones / i-pads or any other electronic gadget.

16. Spare some moments to spend quality time with your child.

17. Check Snap homework regularly.

- 5. No student will be allowed to leave the school premises after entering the school.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

The school transport (24 seater mini bus) is the safest of all ways to transport the child to and from school.

- School is responsible for picking up and dropping the child back, in time.
- School bus always has a teacher and a peon on board to take care of the child in case of an emergency.

MEETING THE HEADMISTRESS

Parents can meet the headmistress from <u>9 A.M. to 11 A.M.</u> on all working days.

MEETING THE CLASS TEACHERS

Parents are called to the school on special P.T.M. organized by the school. The parents should attend the P.T.M. along with their wards. **Students should come in proper school uniform to attend the PTM.** Parents should also be decently dressed. In case of any emergency, parents are requested to meet the class teacher after school i.e. 2:00 P.M. to 2:30 P.M.

Instruction of Payment of FEES 2019-20

- 1. Fee card must be produced on the payment of fee.
- 2. Payment can be made in cash or by cheque only upto 15th of the month in which it is due as per the schedule.

3. Default in non- payment in the paying month attracts fine. Name of the ward is likely to be struck off from school roll for consecutive default for 3 months.

- 4. Fee counter will remain open on all working days other than public or Gazette holidays.

You are what you consume!

The school lays great emphasis on physical fitness of students and tries to provide facilities for games, sports and recreational activities.

It is of utmost importance to impart health education to our children so that they can become fit and confident individuals.

1. All parents must ensure that children:

- Maintain personal hygiene such as trimming of nails/ hair and stay neat and clean.
- Exercise regularly. Have a balanced diet.
- Must avoid consumption of eatables from roadside vendors and kiosks.
- Be immunized regularly against prescribed infections and diseases (Chicken pox, cholera, measles, whooping cough and jaundice) must observe the prescribed period of quarantine.

2. Students suffering from infectious diseases such as conjunctivitis, dermatitis and scabies etc. **should not be sent to school until they have fully recovered and are fit to attend classes.** The same must be certified by a qualified doctor in the form of a medical certificate to be sent to the class teacher.

3. <u>Any special medication or ailment must be brought to the notice</u> of all concerned along-with supporting medical documents.

Evaluation system

Evaluation is an integral part of teaching learning process. The objective of evaluation at primary level is continuous and comprehensive assessment of the growth and the development of the child in the various areas of learning set in the curriculum. It is child friendly and is in adherence to the DAVCMC guidelines. The assessment of students is conducted throughout the year by means of observation, interaction and specially designed worksheets.

System of Evaluation P.S. to Class ii

The evaluation process of class 1 & 2 is according to the early education development program (EEDP) introduced by the DAV Education Board. The program designed intends to help children grow, learn and develop physically, socially, emotionally, morally and intellectually, thus leading to holistic development. Child will be evaluated on the basis of his/her day to day performance. Formal tests would not be conducted. To check the clarity of concepts, small assessments will be held as class test/surprise test at the end of particular chapter done or concept given.

Class III to VII

In addition to pen and paper test the student will be evaluated on the basis of their class assignment, home assignment, activities, projects which are included as their subject enrichment activities. Emphasis will be laid on the overall growth and confidence of the child to develop his/her personality. The child will be evaluated in both scholastic and co-scholastic areas.

ASSESSMENT STRUCTURE CLASS III TO Vii

(A) Scholastic assessment

Scholastic Assessment has been divided into two terms.

Term I includes U.T.-1, U.T.-2, Half Yearly Exams, Notebook and Subject Enrichment Activities.

Term II includes U.T.-3, U.T.-4, Final Exam, Notebook and Subject Enrichment Activities.
